Re: Legislative Update

This Week at The Capitol:

After last week's budget hearings, this was a much quieter week for YSBs.

On Tuesday, the Children's Committee held a public hearing on SB 2, AAC Social Equity and the Health, Safety and Education of Children. On Thursday, the Children's Committee passed AAC the Online Sale and Delivery of Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems and Vapor Products. I have included the substitute language here: https://www.cga.ct.gov/2021/kiddata/sl/2021HB-06110-R00LCO05021KID-SL.PDF The bill passed unanimously 13-0. The measure now heads to the House for further action.

During the Appropriations', Human Services subcommittee DCF Budget presentation earlier this week, Representative Nolan of New London, a big supporter of YSBs, asked Commissioner Dorantes if the YSB transition was going well. The Commissioner stated that YSBs were indeed being brought into the DCF fold and in fact, her staff went out of the way to say how important YSBs were to the system. Rep. Nolan also wanted to know if they needed more support? Upon hearing his question, I emailed Rep. Nolan and he requested that CYSA send him funding information. This information will be provided prior to next Monday's Human Services subcommittee work session so he can question the Commissioner and her staff in greater detail.
